*****IMPORTANT INFORMATION*****

When registering a vehicle, the **law** requires that the registrant show proof of insurance. Your insurance card must show the correct VIN and a *beginning* and *ending* date for the insurance coverage which must include the day you are registering. When registering a "new" vehicle, you must have the **Monroney Label** (window sticker). Car dealers should include with your paperwork this label, a **blue** application for title and a sales agreement showing Maine sales tax paid. Please bring all these forms to the town office when registering. This does **not** apply to private sales which require an original title and bill of sale. Remember, you must **always** start at your Town Office when registering a motor vehicle. We will collect excise tax and send you to BMV in Augusta if we are unable to complete the transaction. If you are re-registering with no changes, you can do this online through our website.

Dear Pittston Townspeople,

As I was preparing this letter for you, I went back through my agendas, minutes, and notes, to refresh my memory of this past year's events. It was similar to reading a diary and recalling those things that brought success to our town, and events that we labored through. Yes, it's been an eventful year!

We welcomed Cathy Jewett Thomas to the Select Board. Cathy brings a great deal of enthusiasm and business knowledge to the Board and seeks practical knowledge by getting "out in the field", attending MMA municipal classes, and following up with citizens' suggestions. This summer we lost our Code Enforcement Officer, Bruce Engert, when he passed away. Bruce had been with the Town of Pittston for many years. That loss was soon filled by Greg Lumbert. Although Greg is also a Code Enforcement Officer in other towns, he is very active in Pittston working with new builds, site visits, and ordinance/permit needs.

The Town's present "in house" staff has had a very successful year of keeping our Town functioning at high performance. Only a little more than a year ago, Val Hanson, Samantha Cameron, Marie Flowers, and Christian Jensen didn't even know each other. Working in their new environment they've managed to bring about up-dated and current recordkeeping, initiated effective office procedures, and were able to keep our town office functioning, at times, under difficult situations. It is with a heavy heart that we will be seeing "Sammy" move on to another town to continue municipal work. She was a good part of that "team work".

I believe the Town's strides forward are also due, in large part, to the work and cooperation of our volunteers. We have a dedicated committee, the Ordinance Review Committee, working on up-dating years' old ordinances and new State mandated objectives, a group interested in seeking ideas for use of public lands, and persons interested in recycling practices. There are other opportunities for those interested in short- and long- term participation in town activities. Although we did "labor through" some events: litigation, a contentious election, and a court hearing, I feel the Town has served its citizens well. Dear Maine Resident:

I have always been guided by the belief that to strengthen our state, we have to invest in our greatest asset: the people of Maine. With the support of the Legislature, my Administration has been investing in what people need to succeed, like job training, child care, health care, education, broadband, and housing.

We are seeing results — small businesses are expanding their operations; people are moving here to work and raise their families; and graduates are staying in Maine to pursue rewarding, life-long careers. We have made good progress over the past six years to ensure that every person in Maine can find a good-paying job in a rewarding and stable career; go to the doctor when they feel sick because they have health insurance; and have the peace of mind that their children are safe at home and at school.

I look forward to working with communities and citizens across the state to solve problems, manage our finances, and keep our people healthy and safe.

Dear Friends:

It is an honor to represent Maine in the United States Senate, and I welcome this opportunity to share several key accomplishments for our state from the previous year.

As Vice Chair of the Appropriations Committee in 2024, I have secured nearly \$580 million for 230 projects across all of Maine's 16 counties to promote job creation, workforce training, and economic development; expand access to health care; support law enforcement; improve public education and infrastructure; and protect our environment. As the new Congress begins, I am honored to be taking the helm of the Committee, the first Mainer to do so in nearly a century, and I remain committed to ensuring that federal spending produces real results for our state and nation.

Maine has the oldest average age in the country, which is why I have long prioritized health-focused legislative efforts. There were more than 1,860 health care bills introduced during the 118th Congress. Only 15 health care bills were signed into law, and I was a lead sponsor of five of them. These bills will enhance care for individuals with Alzheimer's, autism, and substance abuse issues through improved research funding, strengthened public health programs, and increased support for rural first responders.

Another important bill that I coauthored was the *Social Security Fairness Act*. Since 2003, when I led the first-ever Senate hearing on the Windfall Elimination Provision and the Government Pension Offset, I have sought to end these provisions of the *Social Security Act* that unfairly reduce the Social Security benefits that public employees or their spouses have earned. I am pleased to say that with the passage of my bill, the *Social Security Fairness Act*, in December, public sector retirees will now receive the full Social Security benefits they have earned.

When the Maine way of life was under threat, I was certain to defend the interests of our state. I worked to protect Maine's potato farmers when the Department of Agriculture tried to reclassify the potato from a vegetable to a grain. I thwarted efforts to consolidate USPS mail operations at the Hampden postal facility, which would have disrupted mail delivery throughout our state. I sounded the alarm with leaders at the FBI and Departments of State and Treasury on the spate of illicit marijuana growing operations that are destroying properties and providing refuge to foreign criminals in our state. Following damage to our working waterfronts after last winter's storms, I secured \$15 million to help fishing communities recover. I championed funding to support the Maine Air National Guard base, Bath Iron Works, and Portsmouth Naval Shipyard.

As of last December, I have cast more than 9,100 consecutive votes, continuing my record of never missing a roll-call vote since my Senate service began in 1997. My ranking as the most bipartisan Senator reflects Maine's tradition of working with a spirit of cooperation and respect.

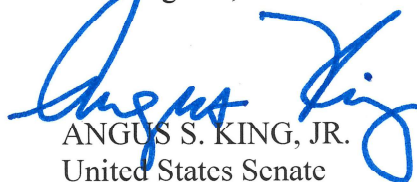

My office can help to resolve challenges with a wide range of programs, including Social Security, veterans' benefits, passport renewals, and more. As you know, communities around Maine have experienced major damage as a result of winter storms and widespread flooding in recent months. These storms have underscored the importance of disaster preparation, particularly as we face the growing impact of climate change. I am working closely with Governor Mills and her administration to ensure that federal assistance is available for both short-term recovery needs and long-term resiliency planning. My office can also provide more information about the annual Community Project Funding (CPF) process. If you know of a project that might be a good fit, I encourage you to keep in touch as more details about the Fiscal Year 2025 funding process become available, as eligibility requirements and limitations can differ from year to year.

With lawmakers gathering once again in Augusta for their Second Regular Session on January 3, I am continually grateful for the opportunity to serve my constituents. If you are ever in need of assistance with respect to State Government, please do not hesitate to contact me.

In addition to the hundreds of bills carried over for further consideration from the First Regular and First Special Sessions of the 131st Legislature, more than 100 new measures have been accepted by the Legislative Council for deliberation over the coming months leading up to the statutory adjournment date of April 17. Amongst these various bill titles are “**An Act to Exempt Motor Vehicles of Active Duty Service Members Stationed Out-of-state from Excise Tax**,” “**An Act to Utilize Career and Technical Education Centers in the Development of the Electrician Workforce**,” and “**Resolve, to Establish a Pilot Project to Alleviate the Crisis in the Offices of Regional Child Protective Services**.” After-deadline bill requests to be further assessed by legislative leaders are sure to ensue. Some of these will no doubt relate to the tragic events that unfolded in Lewiston last October.

State finances will, of course, be a major topic of discussion, as well. A \$265 million surplus will prompt debate on whether to spend more on additional programs, or return this excess to its source – you the taxpayers. Rest assured, with goods and services still costing extensively more, I am committed to providing meaningful tax relief to help fellow Mainers make ends meet.

Once more, I wish to thank you for allowing me to be your voice at the State House. Be sure to follow legislative proceedings as they unfold online via the Legislature’s Web site, <https://legislature.maine.gov/>. By staying informed, you will be empowered with the ability to make good decisions and respond effectively.

The Kennebec County Sheriff's Office is pleased to make the following report regarding the services we provided to the people of Kennebec County in 2024. These services include the Law Enforcement Division, Corrections Services, Civil Process, Court and Transport Division. We provided many regional assets to our communities including a K-9 Teams, Dive Team, Sex Offender Registry, Veterans Advocacy and Accident Reconstruction.

In 2024, Law Enforcement Deputies logged thousands of calls for service. Our call service area widened a bit covering calls for service in the City of Hallowell as there staffing levels at that agency are very low.

One type of call has fortunately decreased: overdoses of prescribed medications or illicit substances. I personally believe the increase in treatment options, both locally and nationally, has had an impact on overdose deaths. This Sheriff's Office will always support our citizens with substance dependency disorders by providing avenues that can assist with their recovery.

In 2021 a shift in the balance of call taking we had shared with the Maine State Police required my office to expand the Law Enforcement Division by two Deputies. In 2022, 2023 and 2024 a new deputy position was added to my roster to bolster staffing needs to provide increased calls for service.

On December 30, 2024, I appointed Chris Read as my Chief Deputy. He has over three decades of experience in law enforcement and is a highly respected member of our team. His appointment to this position assures the highest service available to Kennebec County Residents.

In 2024 our patrol division welcomed Alex Morin, Zack Reynolds, Hunter McCaslin and part-time deputy Garth Coleman to our team. Two of the four mentioned individuals are fully certified LEO's.

In 2024 the Sheriff's Office began School Resource Officer duties for MSAD #11 in Gardiner. The salary and the benefits for the deputy are paid in full by MSAD #11. This is the 3rd SRO position held by a Kennebec County Deputy Sheriff. The other two are MSAD #49 and RSU#38.

My agency continues to receive federal funds to conduct patrol details county wide. To date, the effort of Kennebec County Deputies in those federally funded programs excel statistically for

the number of interdictions for drug related criminal activities. These details are not limited to motor vehicle stops. We have been conducting watercraft details on several different bodies of water here in Kennebec. We have been using our UTV (provided through a federal grant) driving from Augusta to Hallowell and through Farmingdale and into Gardiner on the Rail Trail.

Our Civil Process Deputies serve legal documents on behalf of attorneys, the courts, citizens, local, and state government, landlords and other entities. In 2024, the three civil deputies received over 4,500 requests for service in Kennebec County. This is a decrease from 2023. Some of the services include civil summons & complaints, foreclosures, evictions, small claims, child support notices from the State and enforcement of court orders and writs to name a few.

During the past year, our Correctional Facility managed 2600 inmate intakes. The offenses committed by defendants included everything from Trespass to Homicide. Substance abuse and the proper treatment of citizens with mental illness continue to be two primary concerns at the Correctional Facility.

Inmates at the Kennebec County Correctional Facility are asked to work and earn time off their sentences if applicable. Inmates who are a risk to the community work inside the facility cleaning and cooking, while others are supervised on outside projects. One may think that this only benefits the County, or our local municipalities, but it does not. It also benefits the inmate population as well. They are very hard workers, and they make a difference.

We are committed to providing innovative programs to reduce crimes, assist victims, and to provide enhanced public safety. We acknowledge the ever-growing opiate addiction problem nationwide and have committed to partnerships at the Federal, State and Local levels to combat this problem. Our approach is aggressive enforcement, education, treatment and recovery for those afflicted with this horrible addiction.

I would like to thank all my administrative staff who support the patrol division, detective division, correctional division and the civil deputies. The amount of paperwork that is handled by these individuals is staggering and their work is greatly appreciated. Job well done by all.

As your Sheriff, and moving forward into 2025, my focus will remain constant, serving the people of this county and our visitors honorably, professionally through good common sense and good judgement.

Absentee ballots are ready and the last day for absentee voting is Wednesday, March 12th at the close of business.

Just a friendly reminder, if you have not licensed your dog yet there is now a \$25.00 late fee. Dog licenses are due December 31st of each year, you have a one-month grace period before the late fee goes on February 1st. The late fee is in addition to the dog license fee. Be sure to have the current rabies certificate and neutered or spayed certificate if applicable.

We congratulate 32 couples that were married in 2024 and 20 new bundles of joy. Sadly we will miss and remember 38 loved ones, including our CEO Bruce Engert who is no longer with us. Be sure to bring ID, and proof of lineage if requesting a certified copy of Death or Birth. 2024 Treasurer and Tax Collector's Report

The Town of Pittston encountered many financial challenges in 2024. Not only did the Town complete a major culvert replacement on Pinkham Road, it also saw the turnover and introduction of new personnel in the roles of Town Clerk, Deputy Clerk, Administrative Assistant, Code Enforcement Officer, and Addressing Officer.

As Treasurer, I have begun a modest reorganization of the expense accounts, grouping like expenses together and creating additional sub-accounts for tracking expense details related to both payroll and accounts payable. Additionally, I have begun mapping out the expenses by month for a given budgeting year to help the Town's finances (i.e. "cash flow"). These changes bring greater transparency in the budgeting process as we start our new fiscal year.

Speaking of fiscal year, in 2025 the Town will begin a fiscal year transition that passed at the Annual Town Meeting in 1997. To accomplish this change, the 2025-26 fiscal year will span 18 months, from January 1, 2025, to June 30, 2026. Thereafter, the Town will have a fiscal year that is aligned with the State of Maine and Kennebec County, which runs from July 1 to June 30 each year.

Through the transition, there will be only two tax payments per calendar year (two in 2025, two in 2026, etc.). In 2025, those payments will be much like the recent past, the first payment falling around the beginning of September and the second payment falling on November 30, 2025. Beginning in 2026, the two payments will be on April 30 and October 31 each year.

However, to complete this fiscal year transition the current budget/tax "year" (in reality, 18 months) will include three tax payments (two in 2025 and one in 2026). The dates for these three payments will be: 30 days after commitment (around early September 2025), November 30, 2025, and April 30, 2026. The taxpayers' second payment in 2026 will be the first payment of the next budget/tax year (2026-2027) and will be due on October 31, 2026. (The bill for this will arrive in August of 2026.)

Though this change presents some modest challenges, both taxpayers and the Town will ultimately benefit. Taxpayers will have more notification between receiving their tax bills and the payment due dates, the payment dates will be exactly six months apart and on the same day every year, and payments will not be due during the end-of-year/holiday season. The Town will benefit by receiving revenue earlier in its fiscal year, enabling it to more readily meet its payment obligations on time. Lastly, the predictable payment dates will benefit mortgage escrow companies that make tax payments on your behalf.

This fiscal year change is a critical step in being able to better predict Town finances (cash flow) and longer-term financial health, not to mention being able to predict, with a reasonable degree of accuracy, the expected mil rate while voting on the budget at Town Meeting.

Opinions

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of the governmental activities, each major fund, and the aggregate remaining fund information of the Town of Pittston, Maine, as of and for the year ended December 31, 2023, and the related notes to the financial statements, which collectively comprise the Town's basic financial statements as listed in the table of contents.

In our opinion, the financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the respective financial position of the governmental activities, each major fund, and the aggregate remaining fund information of the Town of Pittston, Maine, as of December 31, 2023, and the respective changes in financial position for the year ended in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Basis for Opinions

We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standard generally accepted in the United States of America. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Town of Pittston, Maine, and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audit. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinions.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Town of Pittston, Maine's ability to continue as a going concern for twelve months beyond the financial statement date, including any currently known information that may raise substantial doubt shortly thereafter.

Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditors' report that includes our opinions. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

In performing an audit in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards, we:

Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements.
- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Town of Pittston, Maine's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Required Supplementary Information

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require that the management's discussion and analysis and budgetary comparison information be presented to supplement the basic financial statements. Such information is the responsibility of management and, although not a part of the basic financial statements, is required by the Governmental Accounting Standards Board, who considers it to be an essential part of financial reporting for placing the basic financial statements in an appropriate operational, economic, or historical context. We have applied certain limited procedures to the required supplementary information in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America, which consisted of inquiries of management about the methods of preparing the information and comparing the information for consistency with management's responses to our inquiries, the basic financial statements, and other knowledge we obtained during our audit of the basic financial statements. We do not express an opinion or provide any assurance on the information because the limited procedures do not provide us with sufficient evidence to express an opinion or provide any assurance.

Supplementary Information

Our audit was conducted for the purpose of forming opinions on the financial statements that collectively comprise the Town of Pittston, Maine's basic financial statements. The combining and individual nonmajor fund financial statements are presented for purposes of additional analysis and are not a required part of the basic financial statements. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the basic financial statements. The information has been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audit of the basic financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the basic financial statements or to the basic financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. In our opinion, the combining and individual nonmajor fund financial statements are fairly stated, in all material respects, in relation to the basic financial statements as a whole.

Other Information

Management is responsible for the other information included in the annual report. The other information comprises the introductory and statistical sections but does not include the basic financial statements and our auditors' report thereon. Our opinions on the basic financial statements do not cover the other information, and we do not express an opinion or any form of assurance thereon.

In connection with our audit of the basic financial statements, our responsibility is to read the other information and consider whether a material inconsistency exists between the other information and the basic financial statements, or the other information otherwise appears to be materially misstated. If, based on the work performed, we conclude that an uncorrected material misstatement of the other information exists, we are required to describe it in our report.

Management's Discussion and Analysis

Town of Pittston, Maine

As management of the Town of Pittston, Maine, we offer readers of the Town's financial statements this narrative overview and analysis of the financial activities of the Town for the fiscal year ended December 31, 2023. The Town's financial performance is discussed and analyzed within the context of the accompanying financial statements and disclosures following this section.

Financial Highlights

- The Town's assets exceeded liabilities by \$3,822,849 as of December 31, 2023, compared to \$3,954,543 as of December 31, 2022.
- The Town's governmental funds General Fund Balance on a budgetary basis was \$1,604,804 as of December 31, 2023, compared to \$1,973,619 as of December 31, 2022.

Overview of the Financial Statements

The Management's Discussion and Analysis introduces the Town's basic financial statements. The basic financial statements include three components: (1) government-wide financial statements, (2) fund financial statements, and (3) notes to the financial statements. The Town also includes in this report supplemental information to the basic financial statements.

Government-wide Financial Statements

The Government-wide Financial Statements include a Statement of Net Position and a Statement of Activities. These statements provide information about the activities of the Town as a whole and present both a long-term and short-term view of the Town's finances. Financial reporting at this level is similar to the accounting used by most private-sector companies.

The Statement of Net Position includes all assets and liabilities, with the difference reported as net position. Over time, increases or decreases in the Town's net position is one indicator of whether its financial health is improving or deteriorating. Evaluation of overall economic health requires review of other non-financial factors, such as changes in the Town's property tax base and the condition of the Town's roads. While this review includes some financial elements important to an assessment of the municipality's overall economic health, this analysis is not exhaustive and intended to be used as one component of such an evaluation.

Management's Discussion and Analysis

Town of Pittston, Maine

The Statement of Activities reports the current year change in net position. This statement includes all of the current year's revenues and expenses regardless of when cash is received or paid.

The Statement of Net Position and the Statement of Activities is presented for:

- Governmental activities: most of the Town's basic services are reported here, including the police, fire, general administration, streets, and ambulance. Sales taxes, franchise fees, fines, and state and federal grants finance most of these activities.

Fund Financial Statements

For governmental activities, these statements focus on how services were financed in the short term as well as what remains for future spending. Fund financial statements also report the Town's operations in more detail than the government-wide statements by providing information about the Town's most significant funds. The remaining statements provide financial information about activities for which the Town acts solely as a trustee or agent for the benefit of those outside of the government.

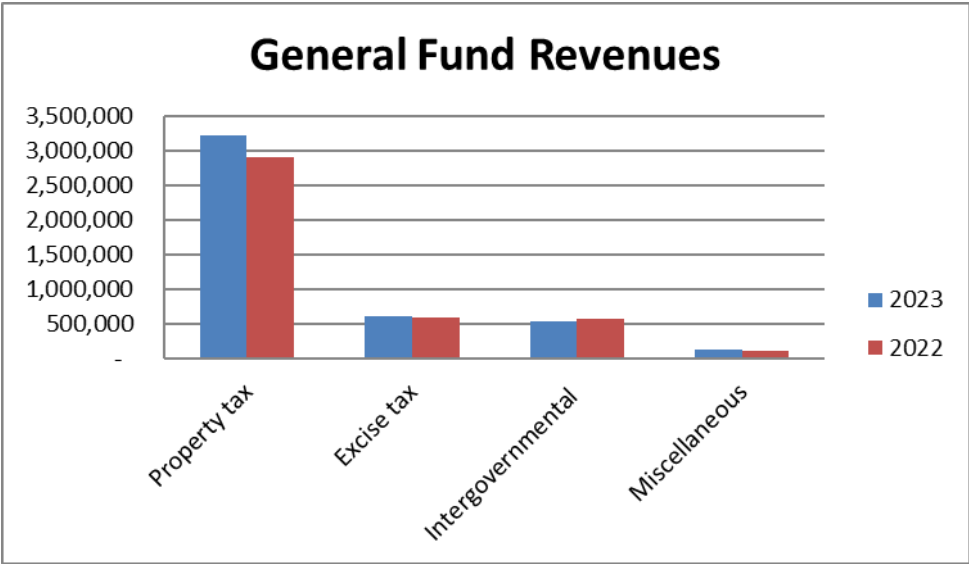

Financial Analysis of the Town's Funds - Fund Financial Statements

Our analysis of the Town’s major funds begins with the fund financial statements and provides detailed information about the most significant funds-not the Town as a whole. Some funds are required to be established by State law. However, many other funds are established to help control and manage money for particular purposes or to show the Town is meeting legal responsibilities for using certain taxes, grants, and other money.

- Governmental funds - All of the Town's basic services are reported in governmental funds, which focus on how money flows into and out of those funds and the balances left at year-end that are available for spending. These funds are reported using an accounting method called modified accrual accounting, which measures cash and all other financial assets that can readily be converted to cash. The governmental fund statements provide a detailed short-term view of the Town's general government operations and the basic services it provides. Governmental fund information helps you determine whether there are more or fewer financial resources that can be spent in the near future to finance the Town's programs. We describe the relationship, or differences, between governmental activities, reported in the Statement of Net Position and the Statement of Activities, and governmental funds in reconciliation at the bottom of the fund financial statements.

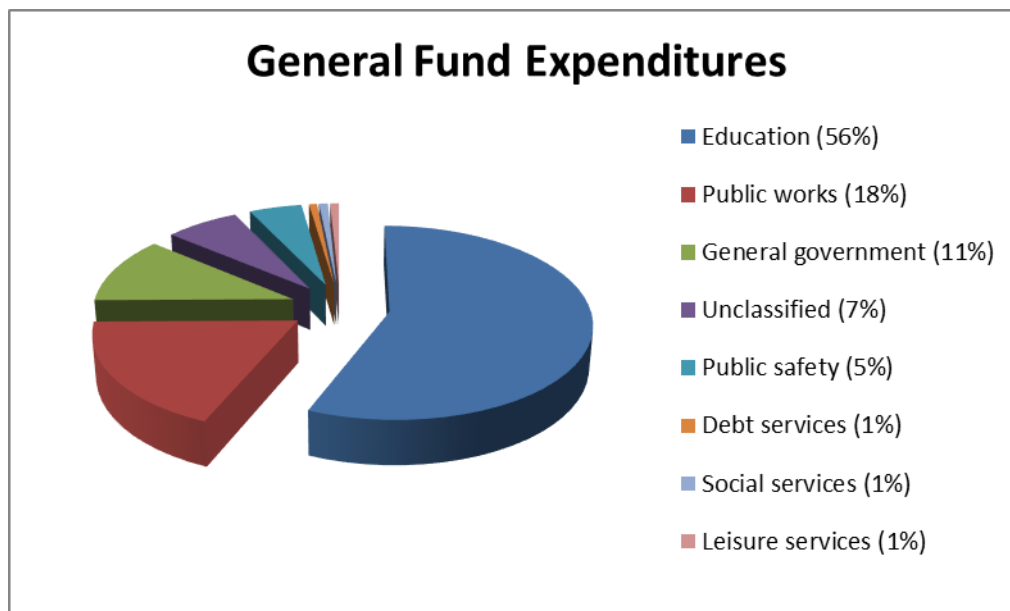
Comparative annual revenues in the general fund on a budgetary basis were as follows:
